But just as God assured Habakkuk – “*Wait and watch; you won’t believe what I will do*” – I trust He is at work today in the most challenging places, through believers around the world.

Last year, I met back-to-back with workers in Israel and the Near East. In Israel, team members described running down to the sub-basement every time the bomb sirens went off. And then one worker spoke up: “*It’s hard, but in 15 years, I’ve never been able to meet the people in my apartment building before. Now I gather together with Jews, Muslims and nominal Christians each time the sirens blare.*”

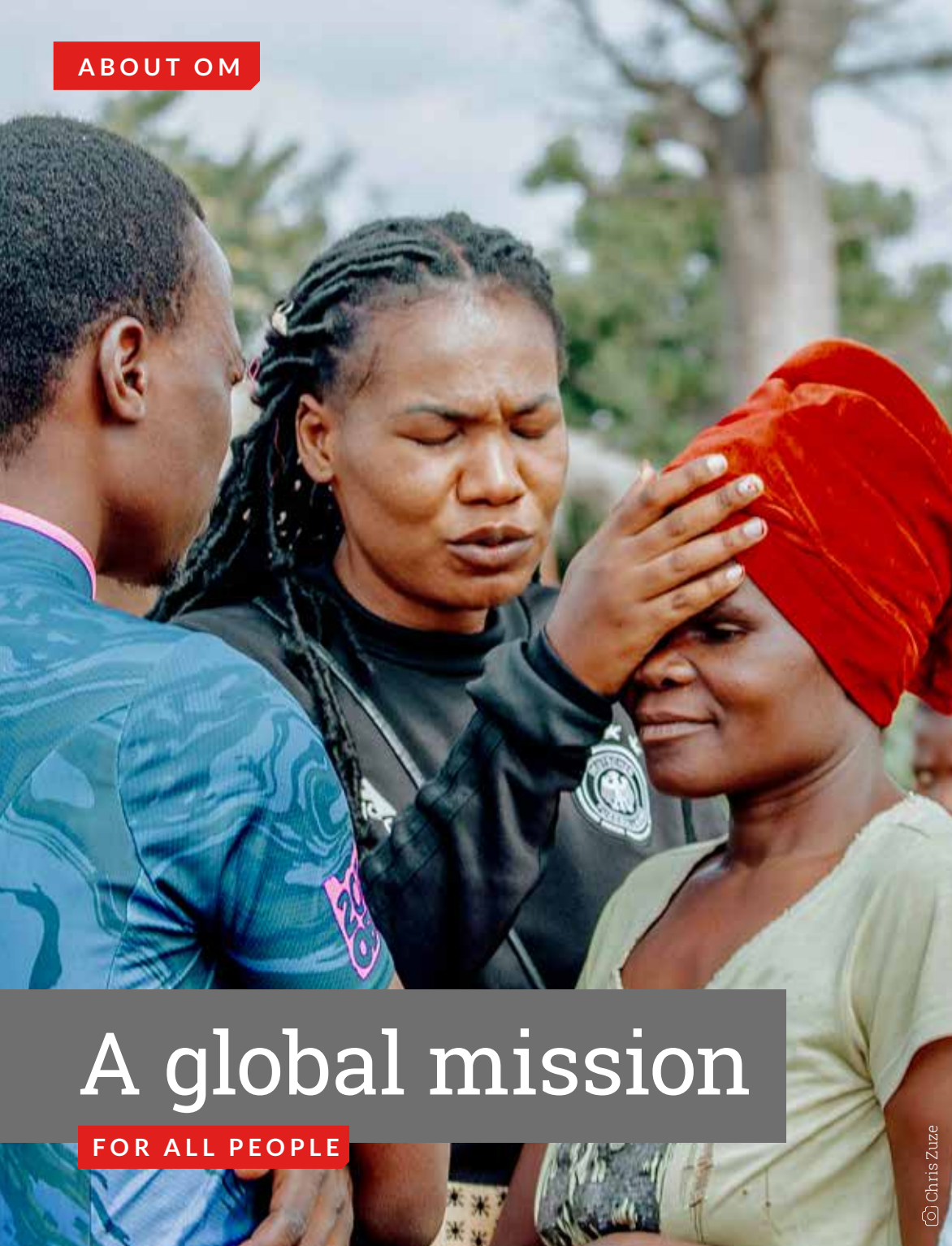
And in the Near East, displaced Muslim communities are moving into Christian areas, where they are encountering Jesus followers, receiving care and hearing the gospel.

As we continue to send more workers and sustain those serving overseas, let us echo the prophet Habakkuk’s prayer: “*Lord, I have heard of your fame; I stand in awe of your deeds, Lord. Repeat them in our day, in our time make them known*” (Habakkuk 3:2a, NIV).

This year, you have helped hundreds of American believers take deeper steps into God's mission and explore new pathways to the least reached. **Thanks to your support**, OM USA engaged these people in missional opportunities, some participating for one day, and others stepping into multi-year commitments.



Your generosity advanced OM's work globally to support and empower local workers to reach the least reached.

\$28 million was raised for OM projects and workers worldwide.

Over 8.9 million people were impacted through **395** projects.

People Care

Your partnership allowed OM workers to thrive on the field. Regular care helped them navigate difficult situations and serve from a place of intimacy with Christ, well-being and longevity.

- 435 OM workers received care from our team.
- Also, **four international trips** were taken by our People Care staff, providing in-person support through **105 face-to-face meetings**.

Prayer

Prayer is at the heart of our movement.

- OM initiated a 15-minute **daily prayer call open to 200+ workers** in the U.S., deepening our dependence on the Lord.
- The Freedom Challenge, an OM ministry, had **160 women participate in challenges** to raise funds and awareness for anti-human trafficking. **Prayer teams led each group** in guided intercession, while **231 additional prayer partners** interceded for vulnerable women and children.

Innovation

- OM led **36 high school students** on two trips to the Arabian Peninsula and the UK, giving hands-on exposure to ministry and marketplace opportunities. The high school then invited us to teach **Discovery Bible Study to 130 students**.
- We also partnered with **InterVarsity** to expand the reach of our summer internship program, placing **eight college interns** in Southeast Asia, the Netherlands and the Arabian Peninsula.
- This year, we also led a **vision trip to the Arabian Peninsula**, connecting job candidates with professional opportunities and missional communities.

Thank you for making these new partnerships and pathways possible as we engage the next generation.

Hope for the hopeless

CAUCASUS

Children and teenagers in the Caucasus often endure poverty, isolation, neglect and abuse. Most face these hardships without the hope of Jesus, as believers remain few in this region. Fidan,* who leads youth ministry for the OM team in the Caucasus, is determined to bring change. Through activities, trainings and discipleship, she shares the gospel with young people, equipping them to share their faith with family, friends and neighbors.

In 2024, Fidan and team members traveled to southern Azerbaijan, home to many from the Talysh people group. The Talysh have a distinct culture and language, separate from mainstream Azerbaijani society. With about 850,000 Talysh worldwide—600,000 in Azerbaijan—the group remains almost entirely unreached, despite a handful of believers.

The trip’s main goal was to scout locations for future outreach to Talysh and Azeri youth. Along the way, the team stopped in villages to distribute gifts to children: toys, books, clothes and school supplies. Some families invited them inside, helping build early relationships.

Driving through one village, Fidan spotted a small girl struggling to push a wheelbarrow nearly twice her size. Though they didn’t stop, the sight stayed with her.

Farther on, they saw children with their parents and halted to hand out presents. After distributing to all, one gift remained—a package for a young child.

A local woman approached Fidan. *“There’s a family nearby with a newborn. Please take the gift there.”* The house was a walk away, and Fidan hesitated, but the woman insisted, so she agreed.

On the path, the woman explained the family: three children from two mothers. The man’s first wife had left him and their children; he had remarried, and the baby belonged to his second wife.

Arriving, Fidan recognized the house—the same one with the wheelbarrow girl. Inside, 10-year-old Nurana* approached, cradling her tiny half-sister. Though small for her age, she strained under the baby’s weight. Fidan drew close, noticing Nurana’s dirty, lice-infested hair. Undeterred, she kissed the girl and gave the gift.

The stepmother entered, took the package, and placed it in a box. *“I’ll give it to her later,”* she said. Fidan suspected she would keep it for her own child instead.

Nurana’s eyes shone with hope. Fidan promised, *“I’ll come back with something just for you.”* Nurana said nothing, but her gaze clung to the promise.

Months later, Fidan returned with gifts. In the yard, a child greeted her—Nurana, but with her hair shaved short. Fidan first mistook her for a boy. Nurana shyly admitted the cut was to eliminate lice. Fidan had brought special shampoo, but it was no longer needed.

Joyful, Nurana called her parents. They welcomed Fidan for tea and introduced her to Nurana’s father and brother. She presented gift boxes containing school backpacks, pencils, pens and supplies for both children.

Nurana beamed. Her stepmother noted the timing was perfect—school was starting, and they couldn’t afford supplies. The family invited Fidan to stay for a meal, but she declined politely, promising future visits.

Fidan believes God divinely connected them. She prays Nurana’s family will come to faith, becoming a “family of peace” that partners in ministry across the region.

Please pray for salvation to reach Nurana and her household. Ask God to raise up workers to share Jesus’ good news with hopeless children throughout the Caucasus. As Jesus says in Matthew 11:28, *“Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.”* Pray these children find that hope, follow Him and experience His true rest. •

Reaching out online

SOMALIA

By sowing broadly through social media, Shino and Shania are seeing fellow Somalis turn to Jesus.

For least-reached people groups spread out around the globe or living in contexts where the gospel cannot be freely shared, social media has proven to be an effective way to share about Jesus. This is the case for ministering to Somalis in Somalia, as well as to the Somali diaspora. An estimated 53 percent of the 28 million Somalis live outside of Somalia, with the highest numbers being in Kenya, Ethiopia and Djibouti. Yet, the global number of Somalis who follow Jesus is still less than 1 percent according to The Joshua Project.

Shino and his wife, Shania—both from a Somali Muslim background themselves—are passionately reaching out to their own people group with the message of Jesus—primarily online. They began their online ministry, Somali Christian TV Media Ministries, through OM in 2016. Transformed by their own encounters with Jesus, the couple utilizes a variety of platforms,

including Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, TikTok and a website to reach out to fellow Somalis. They regularly face opposition and threats as they share but remain confident that the message of hope, joy and life found in Christ must be spread.

THE COST OF FOLLOWING CHRIST

“A Somali will say that they are a Muslim and then that they are Somali,” explained Shino. “So when my wife and I left Islam, we had people say to us: ‘You cannot be Somali’. This is how it is for those who choose to follow Christ. They lose their families, they cannot go home and they may lose their lives.”

Abdi* lives in Somalia and came to faith after listening to Shino and Shania’s online teaching. He is growing deeper in his faith through an online discipleship program with the couple, but faces challenges. Because his community does not have good internet connectivity and is not a safe environment for him to speak freely about his faith, Abdi walks 4 miles one way to join the calls. “We told him to ‘Stay home, we will find a different way to disciple you,’ but he said, ‘No, I want

to be with the team. It gives me encouragement that I see you and know other believers; to pray together and to ask my questions.” Committed, Abdi continues to make the long walk every week to join other Somali Jesus followers in fellowship and to grow in his faith.

“The Somali Jesus followers are like the widow [in Mark 12] who came to give God all the money she had at the synagogue—even if it was very little. And Jesus told the disciples that her small gift was greater than all the others’, because she gave all she had to live on,” Shino explained. “The believers in Somalia, they are giving up all they have, just to follow Christ—and we can all learn from their sacrifice.”

Please pray for the many Somali viewers and listeners who are engaging with the gospel message that is shared online—that they would hear the truth and believe. Pray for wisdom as Shino and Shania teach and share about Jesus. May Somali Jesus followers grow in their faith and be powerful testimonies of hope in their families and communities. •

Addressing the needs

MALAWI

Through self-help groups in Malawi, Jesus followers are engaging deeply with communities to share the love of Christ.

Malawi has significant challenges for its population of 21 million. Poverty, high population growth and increasing pressure on agricultural land have contributed to high levels of national debt and unemployment, low educational opportunities, challenges with HIV/AIDS and harsh living conditions in this largely rural nation.

OM in Malawi aims to support communities holistically, particularly among one least-reached people group, to empower both men and women.

“Local people are the best experts on their situation. They know how best they can solve their problems. It’s just that

they have not been given opportunities to look at what they have and can do,” points out an OM leader.

WOMEN LEADING THE WAY

One such opportunity has arisen through women’s self-help groups, which provide education on health, nutrition, human rights and literacy, and explore how participants can share their knowledge and resources. This is counter-cultural in Malawi’s male-led society; families have traditionally looked within at their resources rather than supporting one another to benefit the whole community.

The women’s groups are encouraged to discover what small businesses they can set up with what they already have, working together to succeed. OM microloans are used to buy and share a chicken (or goat) or seed for farming with the rest of the village. Animal and plant manure enriches the cultivation of tomatoes, maize and groundnuts to both eat and sell. Resultant income enables families to send their children to school, benefiting the whole community’s future. The success of the groups has not gone unnoticed, as Doreen, an OM worker who is one of the women’s group leaders, attests:

“We were visiting an area at the invitation of the village headman. He said: ‘I am so worried because what is happening here is only happening to ladies. Why not the men? I am so concerned about [all] my people here—can you help them [too]?’

“We had originally decided to reach out to just the women,” shares Doreen, *“But the inclusion of men will*

enable better results for the families and communities involved. That’s how we can bring the gospel to communities practically through addressing local needs. We now have 334 women and 94 men in seven different communities: a total of 18 groups.”

TRUSTING GOD

Olivia, a follower of Jesus and now a self-help group leader, joined the training to gain a practical skill while studying the Bible.

Olivia married early in life, bore three children, and then adopted her sisters’ children after their deaths, resulting in nine children to care for. Overwhelmed, Olivia’s husband left. Grieving the loss of her sisters, while providing for their children and her own, Olivia also felt the social stigma of being divorced.

“I took a rope to hang myself,” Olivia says. *“But someone noticed I hadn’t been to the self-help group and came to see me. They had shared in the Bible study how we must trust God, no matter what: to put Him first, knowing our situation. I had to do the same.”* She knelt and started to pray, asking God to forgive her. Throwing the rope away, she started to feel better in her heart.

Today, Olivia encourages others to trust Him. She knows that by breaking down her problems, step by step with God, identifying what she has, and contributing together, she co-creates a strong, wholesome community that will last the years. Just as she learned how to build her own house, stone by stone, slowly but surely, she is trusting in His equipping. •

DISCIPLE PURPOSEFULLY

OM discipled those who will live out the gospel and multiply Christ's love.

We are seeking to build self-sustaining, vibrant communities of Jesus followers in key regions around the world. For these communities to develop into vital, healthy bodies that reproduce, there needs to be intentional investment in discipleship. This helps to develop local leadership, encourage sustainability, foster reproducibility and drive local impact.

The power of prayer

PAKISTAN

Hinduism is the second-largest religion in Pakistan and Sindh province has Pakistan’s highest percentage of Hindus overall, with around 5.2 million people identifying as Hindu.

In this area lives Nazira*. As one of the few Jesus followers in the region, she has been a person of peace within her community, welcoming the OM team and other believers into her home for fellowship.

Nazira always enjoyed hearing stories of Jesus’ miracles, but never expected that she would one day experience one personally. OM team member Pervaiz said, “We often shared short stories of the miracles of Christ, prayed together and encouraged her in the faith. Over time, her faith grew stronger.

“One day, Sister Nazira fell seriously ill due to a severe liver problem. Doctors informed her that she would need a liver transplant, a procedure costing nearly 8 million PKR (around \$28,000 USD). Coming from a poor family, this was an impossible amount for them, and we also lacked the resources to help in such a large way.

“At that time, the doctor prescribed medicine costing only 1,800 PKR (around \$6 USD). She took the medicine, and we continued to pray earnestly for her healing.

“God answered those prayers miraculously—her swollen abdomen returned to normal, her health was fully restored and she no longer needed surgery.”

OPENING THE DOOR

When people in the village, including Muslims who would normally keep their distance from Hindus, saw this miracle, they visited her home to ask: “Where did you receive this treatment? How did this change happen?”

Nazira was happy to share, “It happened through prayer.” On hearing this, many of her friends and neighbors began to ask for prayer for themselves.

“Soon, our team began visiting the area regularly, and women from the community would come specifically to receive prayer,” Pervaiz said. “Remarkably, through the

witness of this [culturally] Hindu sister, even the majority Hindu community began to trust in the power of prayer.

“This opened the door for regular fellowship gatherings, allowing the gospel to spread in ways we had not seen before.”

Praise God for miraculously healing Nazira and restoring her health without surgery. Pray for Nazira to continue growing strong in her faith and to be a bold witness for Christ. Pray that the women and families coming for prayer will encounter Jesus personally and become His disciples. Pray for God’s protection over Nazira, her family and the OM ministry team as they share the gospel in areas where Christians face opposition. •

This year *Logos Hope* and *Doulos Hope* welcomed 900,000 guests on board the ships. Aiming to stay longer, go further and engage more deeply, OM's two ships were able to visit 28 cities in 17 different countries in 2025.

CHURCHES IN CAMBODIA

RECEIVE WATER BUCKET FILTERS

TO SUPPORT MINISTRY AND CARE

FOR CHILDREN.

Hope in every drop

CAMBODIA/DOULOS HOPE

In rural Cambodia, groups of around 100 children come together each weekend in local church buildings for children’s programs.

In these least-reached communities, access to clean drinking water is especially important—particularly under the intense heat of the Cambodian sun. Without it, gatherings often can’t take place. To meet this basic need, churches frequently stretch their already limited budgets, just to ensure every child has enough to drink.

During *Doulos Hope’s* visit to Sihanoukville, Cambodia, crewmembers were excited to provide water bucket filters to churches serving rural communities, offering clean drinking water without cost. Pastor Im Samkol, of Life Bible Presbyterian Church, helped connect the

crew with local churches, ensuring the filters reached those serving children and families in need.

SMALL CONTRIBUTION, BIG IMPACT

“These filters are a blessing,” he said. “They help us save [resources] and serve better. Every weekend, we spend around \$30 just to buy water for our members. Now, we can redirect that budget to other ministry needs such as planting more churches.”

Life Bible Presbyterian Church provides leadership and practical support to local churches, many of which are led by theology students or recent graduates. Several of these churches received water bucket filters during *Doulos Hope’s* visit. These churches serve communities with limited access to clean water and often limited access to the Good News.

One church now meets on land that was once a wood-cutting factory—a space transformed from industry to ministry. It serves families who move frequently due to seasonal work, such as construction or agriculture. “People come and go, but the church remains,” Pastor Im Samkol explained. “We keep sharing God’s love with whoever arrives.”

Church leaders expressed deep gratitude for the water bucket filters, noting their importance in caring for the children. “When 70 to 100 children gather in

a small space, water is vital,” Pastor Im Samkol said. “Without it, they could get sick. Providing water is part of our ministry... God is providing what we need for His Kingdom.”

Because of Jesus we are reminded that hope often flows through acts of love. A water bucket filter, given in Jesus’ name, is transforming communities and opening doors for the Good News. •

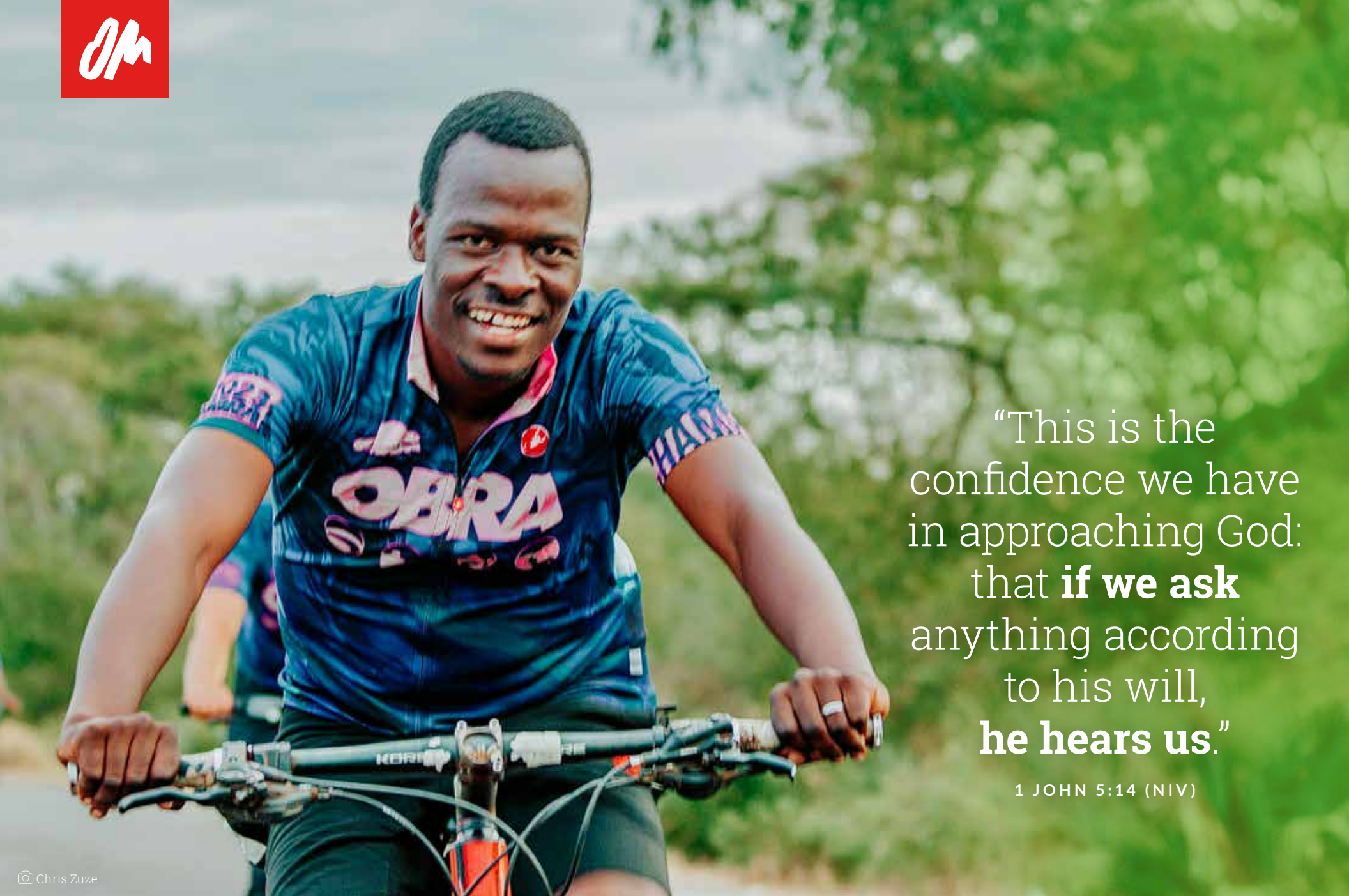
